  - d. "They shall atone for guilty rebellion and for sins of unfaithfulness, that they may obtain lovingkindness for the Land without the flesh of [burnt offerings] and the fat of sacrifice. And prayer rightly offered shall be as an acceptable fragrance of righteousness, and perfection of way as a delectable free-will offering." (Community Rule 1QS IX, 5)
