#### A few observations:

- 1. Grief that goes somewhere rarely follows a straight path!
- 2. Grief is a whole-body experience.
- 3. Grief often surfaces when we begin to recognize and acknowledge our deepest longings.
- 4. Grief over God's absence is still an acknowledgment of God's presence.

I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you,

in a dry and parched land where there is no water.

<sup>2</sup> I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and your glory.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

#### John 4·14

Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

## John 6:35

Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

### Rev 21:6
