# WEEK 3: "... IN THIS PLACE" Land & Exile

#### I. Introduction

# II. "The Land" for the People of God – a Biblical Fly-over

# A. Genesis 1-3

- 1. The garden a gift for human beings for purposes of relationship with God.
- 2. Humans sinned -> exile

# B. Genesis 12 & 15 – God's covenant to Abraham

- 1. God promises to make him a great nation, to bless him, to bless all nations through him; God promises an heir, descendants more numerous than all the stars in the sky, to give the land to him and his descendants as their possession/inheritance
- 2. Abraham is called to leave his land and go to a new land as a 'foreigner'
- C. Exodus God calling his people to Sinai to worship him
  - 1. Ex 19:5-6 The context for bringing Israel into the land is relationship, God's gracious gift as the one who owns all things
  - 2. Ex 23 Describes how God will bring them to take "possession" (to inherit)
- D. Deuteronomy Israel getting ready to enter the land (finally!)
  - 1. The land is God's gift & the fulfillment of his promise to Abraham (Deut 1:5-8)
  - 2. Their possession / inheritance of the land is conditional, even though it is also God's gracious gift to them (Deut 4:1)
  - 3. They are to live in the land in such a way that their conduct points to God (Deut 4:5-8)
  - 4. If they break covenant with the Lord (disobey), they will not be able to stay in the land. (Deut 4:25-31; Deut 28:38-63).
  - 5. Part of living in the land was to show kindness to 'foreigners' (Deut 10:17-19)
  - 6. The land was never meant to be ultimate (Deut 8:10-18)
  - 7. The Temple was the primary place of worship in the land (Deut 12:1-4a)
- E. Exile A Nation Scattered and Shattered
  - 1. Not just about land, but about the loss of the Lord's presence with them
  - 2. Ezek 47:21-23 e.g. prophecies that the nations will come to share the "inheritance" previously thought to be just for Israel (Paul picks up on this in Gal 3-4)
  - 3. "Diaspora" the nations of Israel scattered outside of the land, a reality even when some enter back into the land. Peter draws on this consciousness with a twist...
