- I. Introduction: Checking in
  - A. What are my honest questions and reactions?
  - B. Why is it so hard to move from talking about Scripture to talking about Race?
    - 1. Responses tend to be \_\_\_\_\_, not just logical.
    - 2. We're afraid of being called \_\_\_\_\_

## II. Four Characteristics of Being

- A. Not having to do a lot of thinking about racial/ethnic identity!
  - 1. White as the norm/default/dominant
  - 2. Racialization: a racialized society is "a society wherein race matters profoundly for differences in life experiences, life opportunities, and social relationships" (Emerson/Smith); a narrative of racial difference (Bryan Stevenson)
- B. Carrying around an "Invisible Knapsack"
  - 1. Unearned advantage as well as unearned disadvantage
  - 2. Some examples (including "the ability to \_\_\_\_\_")
- C. Low stamina for talking about race
  - 1. Signs of our defenses going up: anger, fear, guilt, shame, silence, arguing, disengaging or leaving
  - Our brains react to an intellectual threat the same way they respond to a \_\_\_\_\_\_ threat.
  - 3. Two pieces of good news
- D. Formed by a system that tells us that \_\_\_\_\_ is better.

- A. Some definitions
  - 1. Ijeoma Oluo: "any prejudice against someone because of their race, when those views are reinforced by systems of power."
  - 2. Be the Bridge: "*Racism* is a system of advantage based on race, involving cultural messages, misuse of power, and institutional bias, in addition to the racist beliefs and actions of individuals."
- B. A popular myth: racism as solely "individual, conscious, and \_\_\_\_\_"
  - 1. Austin Channing Brown: often "white people are more worried about being called \_\_\_\_\_\_ than about whether their actions are in fact
  - 2. Theology of sin & power of structure -- none of us are exempt from having warped views about \_\_\_\_\_.
