Geoffrey Fulkerson

Geoffrey Fulkerson was raised in the southwest suburbs of Chicago. His father, Alan, was a lawyer, and his mother, Susan, was an accountant and teacher, and both were active civil servants in the local community. He also has one younger brother, Stephen. They were nominal Christians who attended a small mainline Church. For the first 20 years of his life, Geoff neither knew nor followed Jesus, but the catechesis that he received early on—specifically the Apostles Creed—was the assumed religious starting point that would later spark questioning and then, when encountering the face of Christ and the weight of his own iniquity, a spiritual awakening.

That happened during Geoff's senior year of college, at which time he repented of his prior life in the flesh and gave the life ahead to Christ and the church. A spiritual awakening was followed by new theological questions and a search for integrity of life and thought. It was during this season that he met Katherine. They were married within a year and soon after arrived at Trinity's campus, sensing a call to serve Christ's church. (Geoff's faculty advisor was Graham Cole, which would be his first indirect contact with Redeemer.) That was almost 20 years ago. He has also worked at Trinity's Henry Center for Theological Understanding for the past 9 years. They have attended Redeemer for 9 years and have served in Children's Ministry, on the Set-Up Team, and as small group leaders.
