Linda's education includes a BA and an MA in speech and language pathology from California State University at Long Beach and a certificate in Spiritual Direction from Christos Center for Spiritual Formation (christoscenter.org).

Her professional life includes approximately 30 years working as a speech and language pathologist with young children with disabilities.

A parallel professional track includes working alongside her husband Bill+ as a campus minister (Ferris State University, Big Rapids, M) with Campus Ambassadors. She also ministered alongside Bill as he pastored a Baptist Church for 13 years in Glen Ellyn (1980-1993) after leaving campus ministry.

In 1993, she and Bill left the Baptist church and began to attend Church of the Resurrection in Wheaton. She served on the board at Rez. In 1997, she and Bill moved to Church of the Great Shepherd and she was informally ordained (at that time ACNA had not been formed) and served as a deacon.

In 2004, Linda was officially ordained a deacon in AMiA. That year Bill+ and Linda planted a church (Church of the Savior/ACNA) in West Chicago which later moved to Wheaton. She has preaching/teaching gifts and has had the privilege of using her gifts as a pastor and priest (ordained to the priesthood in 2012) and called as associate rector of Church of the Savior at that time.
